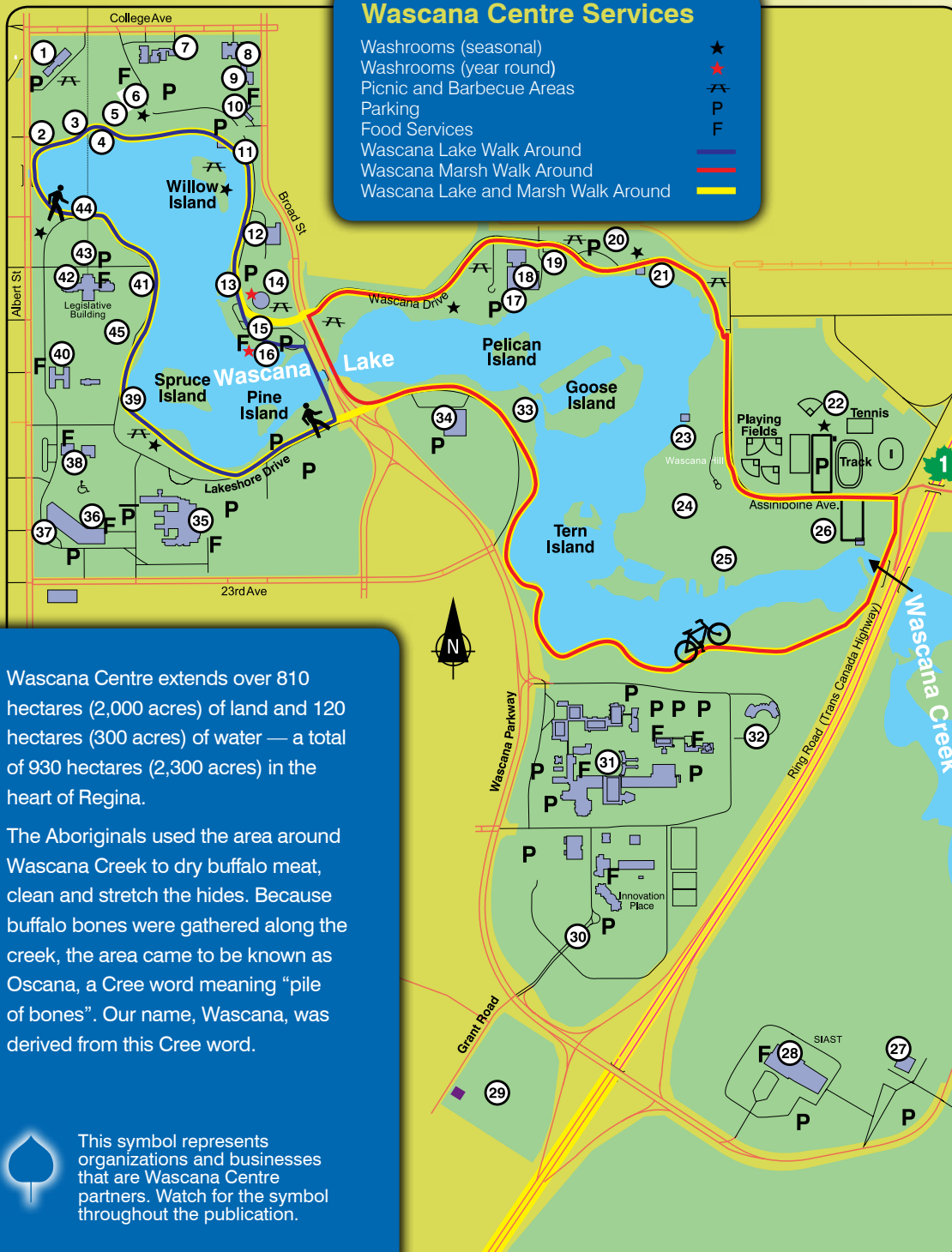

Wascana Centre extends over 810 hectares (2,000 acres) of land and 120 hectares (300 acres) of water — a total of 930 hectares (2,300 acres) in the heart of Regina.

The Aboriginals used the area around Wascana Creek to dry buffalo meat, clean and stretch the hides. Because buffalo bones were gathered along the creek, the area came to be known as Oscana, a Cree word meaning "pile of bones". Our name, Wascana, was derived from this Cree word.
